Worshipping

Psalm 100

Our Book of Confessions asks this question: “What is the chief end of man (and woman too)?” The answer is: “The chief end of man is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever.” Everyone worships. We can’t help but worship. Even people who hate God worship. The real question is: What do we worship? Do we worship money...prestige...power...ourselves...or do we worship the one true living God? We don’t have to worry about getting people to worship, it just that some need to have their worship upgraded!!!

For hundreds of years the Call to Worship in the temple started with “Shout for joy to the Lord all the earth.” Then the rest of this Psalm would have been read. We shout to God because we are not our own, we belong body and soul to a loving Savior. When we truly believe that we are not our own, but we belong to God, worship is easy. Worship is natural. The question is: What are you worshipping? Might you not only glorify the one true living God this next week, might you even enjoy Him.
